Installing softaware


To use LS9 Editor, you'll need to install the following software programs. Follow the appropriate instructions below.

- · DME-N Network Driver
- · Studio Manager
- · LS9 Editor

DME-N Network Driver

To operate the LS9 from your computer via Ethernet, you'll need to install the DME-N Network Driver software. You'll also need to set up DME-N Network Driver after installation. For details, refer to the "DME-N Network Driver Installation Guide".

DME-N Network Driver is software that transfers MIDI data back and forth between your computer and the LS9 via Ethernet cable. Connect the computer to the LS9 by using an Ethernet cable via a switching hub. When you connect the computer to the LS9 directly, you can use either a crossover or straight cable.

Studio Manager Installation

Studio Manager is a cross-platform application that enables you to use multiple Editor programs for remotely controlling Yamaha hardware from your computer, and allows you to save the Editor settings for instant recall. LS9 Editor Installation

Follow the instructions below to install the software programs.

- **1** Extract the data from the downloaded compressed file and open the "Is9_edt***_win" folder. "***" represents the version number.
- 2 Double-click "setup.exe."

 A setup dialog of LS9 Editor is displayed.
- **3** Follow the on-screen instructions to install the software.

Uninstall (removing the installed application)

To remove the installed editors and Studio Manager:

Select [START] \Rightarrow [Control Panel] \Rightarrow [Add/Remove Programs] \Rightarrow [Install/Uninstall], then select the application to be removed and click [Add/Remove...].


Follow the on-screen instructions to uninstall the application.

Getting Started

Overview of Studio Manager

Studio Manager is a cross-platform application that enables you use multiple Editor programs for remotely controlling Yamaha hardware from your computer, and allows you to save the Editor settings for instant recall. You can run Studio Manager as a stand-alone application, or as a plug-in within supported DAW (digital audio workstation) / sequencer applications, such as Cubase SX 3.0.1 or later. In either case, the basic functionality is the same. For the latest information on compatible DAW applications, refer to the following website. http://www.studioconnections.org/



The settings of each editor can be saved and recalled together from Studio Manager or the DAW application. In other words, you can change the settings of your entire system in a single operation by recalling the settings for multiple devices from Studio Manager or your DAW application.

When you want to save setting files, you can do this from Studio Manager to recall multiple devices at once, or from an individual Editor to recall only a specific device. When you save your settings in your DAW application, the Studio Manager settings will also be saved together with the DAW application file, and can also be recalled in the same way.

Network settings of the LS9

When connecting the computer to the LS9 directly.
 You can use the following initial settings.

IP address	192.168.0.128
Gateway address	192.168.0.1
Subnet mask	255.255.255.0

• When you connect the computer to the LS9 via LAN.

Set the appropriate address in accordance with LAN.

Your computer and the LS9 should exist in the same subnet in the same network address.

IP address	Sets the IP address so that it does not conflict with the IP address of any other device on the network.
Gateway address	If you set the IP address, the first three numbers are automatically set. Set the last number of the IP address of the gateway when the gateway exists. Set the vacant address when the gateway does not exist. You should set the address in the same subnet as IP address. The address should be set in the same subnet as IP address within LAN in which the subnet is set.
Subnet mask	Use an initial setting of [255.255.255.0] in LAN environment in which the subnet is not set. In LAN in which the subnet is set, set the address in accordance with the environment.

Network settings of computer

If you are connecting the LS9 to your computer in a one-to-one connection, we recommend that you make the following settings.

IP address	192.168.0.3
Subnet mask	255.255.255.0
Default gateway	192.168.0.1

However, it must not conflict with the IP address of any other device on the network.

The LS9 cannot be directly connected if the IP address is assigned automatically. Please contact your network administrator for further detail.

Starting and setting up Studio Manager

You'll need to perform the following setup in order to use the editors in Studio Manager.

1 Start up Studio Manager.

Click the [Start] button, place your mouse cursor over [Programs (All Programs)] ⇒ [YAMAHA Studio Manager], then click [Studio Manager].

2 Set up Studio Manager.

For details, refer to the PDF manual, found in the [Help] menu on the Studio Manager.

3 Start up each editor.

In the Studio Manager window, double-click the icon for each editor.

4 Set up each editor.

5 Synchronize each editor with your mixing console.

Troubleshooting

When controlling the LS9 from your computer via Ethernet, the LS9 does not operate correctly or no sound is heard.

•	Have you installed the latest DME-N Network Driver?
•	Is the Ethernet cable connected correctly? Connect the computer to the LS9 by using an Ethernet cable via a switching hub or router. When you connect the computer to the LS9 directly, you can use either a crossover or straight cable. LS9 Owner's Manual
•	Is the DME-N Network Driver set up appropriately? Did you enter an appropriate IP address? DME-N Network Driver Installation Guide
•	Is the computer network setup appropriate? Select \Rightarrow [Start] \Rightarrow [Settings] \Rightarrow [Control Panel] \Rightarrow [Network Connections] \Rightarrow [Local Area Connection] \Rightarrow [Property], and confirm the network setup. DME-N Network Driver Installation Guide
•	Are the settings of the LS9 and network devices (including hubs) appropriate? LS9 Owner's Manual or Network device's Owner's Manual
•	Have you selected an appropriate network ports in the LS9 Editor?LS9 Editor Owner's Manual
•	In case the firewall function is enabled for your Windows XP SP2 Installation, an alert message will be displayed indicating that the program is blocked during first start-up of LS9 Editor. In that case, please select the 'Unblock' option.
•	In case the firewall Anti Virus (security) function is enabled you might experience problems controlling LS9 console. In that case, please turn off this firewall function.
